Motion carried.		
Public Hearing Session	President Cederquist asked if anyone wished to address the Board. There was no response.		
Consent Agenda	It was moved by member John Mulligan and seconded by member Johnson to approve the consent agenda which included the following: A. Approval of minutes of the January 20, 2004 meeting as mailed. B. Approval of expenditures, (Attachment A) Motion carried.		
Treasurer's Report	Terri Bechtel presented the financial statement for F.C.S.I.G. and F.C.O.E. for quarter ending March 31, 2004, (Attachment B). The motion to accept the report was made by member John Mulligan and seconded by member Johnson. Motion carried.		
Broker's Report Claims Cost Analysis	The Broker, Bill Tucker Jr. presented the F.C.S.I.G. Claims Cost Analysis for the period March 2004, (Attachment C). He mentioned this year is looking better than last year. A \$16,000 claim included in the report was withdrawn. This reduction will be reflected in the next report.

#### **Broker's Report**

Withdrawal Provisions	The Broker mentioned he had discussed amending the by-laws regarding member withdrawal and terminations with the F.C.S.I.G. attorney. More information will be available at the next board meeting.	
Golf Tournament Name Change	The Broker mentioned the annual JPA golf tournament is scheduled for Thursday, June 10, 2004 at the Sherwood Forest Golf Club with a 1:00 p.m. modified shotgun start. He suggested changing the name of the tournament to the Bill Tucker/Pat Magill Memorial Golf Tournament. He pointed out Pat Magill was instrumental in the formation of the three local JPAs - F.C.S.I.G., O.S.S. (property and casualty JPA), and F.A.S.B.O. (health benefits JPA) serving as president of all three. It was the consensus of the board to amend the name as suggested by the Broker.	
Est. Payroll Calculations	The Broker reported the 4% increase used for calculating the 03/04 year estimated payroll appeared to be too high. It was the consensus of the Board to calculate an increase using a factor of 2%.	
FCSIG Treasurer/ Accounting Clerk	Mr. Tucker introduced Dr. Michelle Steagall, Superintendent/Principal of Clay Elementary, and Carol Williamson, Administrative Assistant/Bookkeeper for Clay Elementary. They have agreed to take over for Kings Canyon Unified, the accounting duties of F.C.S.I.G.	
Administrator's Report	Sharon Castillo, the F.C.S.I.G. claims administrator spoke about SB499, signed by the governor on April 19, 2004. A few of its features are: limiting the length of temporary disability to two years, increasing the medical control of the employer, and eliminating subjective complaints from permanent disability. She mentioned the passage of this bill would require rewriting the labor codes.	
Loss Control Report	Dick Rhodes, the Independent Contractor for Loss Control reported he is in the process of completing his inspections for the year. He suggested the districts think about in-service workshops during the summer especially those pertaining to heat exhaustion.	
	Henry Brock from Brock's Loss Control Services, presented his progress report, (Attachment D) in addition to his Risk Management Report, (Attachment E). The Risk Management Report was designed to help districts identify areas of concern and ultimately assist them in reducing their insurance costs.	
Action Items Investment Policy	The Broker reported on the annual review process of the F.C.S.I.G. Investment Policy as required by accreditation. F.C.S.I.G. had adopted the Investment Policy of Fresno County as their own and a few changes had been made to the policy. The changes involved extending the weighted average from 365 to 550 days, adding a requirement for the purchasing of short-term corporate notes and a glossary of cash management terms & rating summary. The motion was made by member Ford and seconded by member Johnson to continue to use the Fresno County Investment Policy as the Investment Policy for F.C.S.I.G., (Attachment F). Motion carried.

F.C.O.E. has paid into the fund the premium to cover the remaining reserves. Motion carried.	
Rescinding Notice Of Withdrawal	The Broker reported on receiving letters from two districts rescinding their notice to withdrawal from F.C.S.I.G. The districts were Riverdale Unified School District and Central Valley Preschool. The motion to accept the two districts' rescission of their notice to withdraw from F.C.S.I.G. was made by member Johnson and seconded by member Steve Mulligan. Motion carried.	
SETECH Proposal	The Broker presented a proposal by Service Enhancements Technologies (SETECH) for an in depth study of the financial stability and funding of F.C.S.I.G., (Attachment J). The cost would be between \$5,000 to \$7,000. This would be a one time analysis. The motion was made by member Johnson and seconded by member John Mulligan to approve the SETECH proposal. Motion carried.
