SUBJECT: Child Abuse Reporting Requirements

A brief review of the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act (CANRA) and AB1432 may be helpful:

- All staff members, including substitutes, must annually complete child abuse reporter training within the
 first six weeks of school or within six weeks of the hire date. This online training is available at
 www.getsafetytrained.com and is titled Child Abuse Reporting for Educators. It takes approximately 30
 minutes to complete. A certificate of completion may be printed upon successfully finishing the class.
 This certificate will confirm compliance with the training portion of the legislation. Our attorney has
 conducted review of this class to ensure it meets state requirements.
- 2. Taking the above online class replaces a one-to- one-and-a-half-hour class prepared by the California Department of Education (CDE) in conjunction with the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) but requires a one-time waiver (see first attachment above). If you wish to require your staff complete the state-sponsored online class instead, please contact me for details.
- 3. A tracking requirement includes the development of a process to provide proof of completing the required training to the governing board or body of the school district, county office of education, state special school and diagnostic center or charter school. The second attachment is a suggested format to meet this requirement.

REPORTING ON ALTERNATIVE TRAINING PROVIDED FOR MANDATORY REPORTERS

California requires that school employees receive annual training on the identification and reporting of child abuse and neglect. The California Department of Education (CDE), in conjunction with the California Department of Social Services (CDSS), provides an online training module for this purpose. California *Education Code* Section 44691(c) requires that "School districts, county offices of education, state special schools and diagnostic centers operated by the State Department of Education, and charter schools that do not use the online training module provided by the State Department of Social Services shall report to the State Department of Education the training being used in its place."

For the convenience of school districts, the CDE has prepared this form for districts that are required to report the alternative training methods used.

MANDATED CHILD ABUSE REPORTER TRAINING CERTIFICATION

Assembly Bill 1432 became law on January 1, 2015 and requires all local educational agencies—school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools (LEAs)—to provide annual training to their employees who are mandated reporters under the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act (Penal Code 11166 et seq.). The California Department of Education interprets "annual" to mean every school year. LEAs must also develop a process for mandated reporters to "provide proof of completing the training within the first six weeks of the school year or within the first six weeks of that person's employment." (Educ. Code 44691.) Thus, all existing employees must be trained and provide proof of that training prior to or within the first six weeks of the start of school. Any employees hired after the school year begins must complete the training and provide proof of completion prior to or within the first six weeks of their employment.

I certify that to the best of my knowledge that during the 2015-16 school year all district employees were in compliance with AB1432.
